

n my 15 years of growing with LCCS, the journey has been one of valleys and mountain top experiences. From living through a financial crisis when LCCS was left with half a month of reserves in 2014, to being recognised by Kincentric as one of the best employers in the social service sector in 2021. y heartiest congratulations to LCCS on their 20th Anniversary Celebration. The theme 'Spirit of Relationships' is an apt summary of the essence and spirit of LCCS and what they stand for. By being a voice for restorative practice, LCCS embodies the message of healing and restoration not just in working with beneficiaries but working with each other as colleagues. It is a testament of walking the talk that they were awarded by Kincentric, a worldwide organisation in people practice, as one of the best employers in the social service sector.

It was not until 2006 that LCCS began their journey in restorative practice, after learning of the process from Professor Dr Dennis Wong who was speaking about his work in bullying intervention. The journey has taken LCCS from the MOE schools to MSF Probations, Corrections and Rehabilitations, Singapore Prison Service and now to the community working with family violence and resolving conflicts between neighbours and in the workplace.

At the heart of this work is the gospel message of healing and forgiveness in relationships. Just as we need God's forgiveness, people will be happier when they learn to forgive and heal their hurts in relationships. LCCS carries that message on behalf of the Lutheran Church in Singapore to the community.

As LCCS celebrates their 20th Anniversary, may they continue to carry the torch in the community with the message that relationships matter!

Mr Mah Bow Tan was a member of the governing People's Action Party (PAP) and an elected Member of Parliament representing the Tampines East ward of Tampines GRC from 1988 to 2015. In Parliament, he was Leader of the House from 2007 to 2011. He also held the Cabinet positions of **Minister for Communications** (1991-1999), Minister for the Environment (1993-1995), and Minister for National Development (1999-2011) before retiring from politics just before the 2015 general election.




